This year's Year 11 cohort have set a Mossbourne Community Academy record with the progress they have made since joining the academy. Staff are thrilled for them, proud of them, and humbled by them, as we celebrate their incredible achievements today. The perseverance, resilience, and pursuit of excellence that they have demonstrated over the years has been rightly rewarded in the grades they have achieved. Staff must also be thanked and congratulated for the guidance and exceptional teaching they have worked hard to provide during their time at Mossbourne Community Academy.

Miss Rebecca Warren, Principal, said "Due to their unwavering efforts, our students have exceeded all expectations and have secured impressive pathways both to the next part of their educational journey and towards their career goals. Their GCSE results are a testament to both their diligence and the exceptional teaching and learning and support cultivated by staff, students and parents of Mossbourne Community Academy."

- Nearly three quarters of all students achieved 5+ in both English and mathematics
- 85% of all students achieved 4+ in both English and mathematics
- 71% of students achieved grades 5 or above in Ebacc subjects
- 47% of all students achieved at least 1 grade 9
- A quarter of all students achieved an 'Attainment 8' score of 8 or better
- Nearly half of all students achieved an 'Attainment 8' score of 7 or better
- Over half of all grades achieved were grade 7 or above

Bianca Salviato Foresti achieved 13 GCSEs, 11 of which were at grade 9 and 2 of which were at grade 8. Obinna Okoro achieved 12 GCSEs, 11 of which were at grade 9 and 1 at grade 8; Obinna won the Robert Walker Prize for Progress at this year's Mossbourne Community Academy Ball.

Since the first public examinations were taken at Mossbourne Community Academy, Mossbournians have ranked among the top 1% in the country for progress. This remarkable achievement highlights the collective effort of our entire community—from the passionate and committed staff, to the students who embody our values of excellence, unity, and a no-excuses mindset and to parents and carers who have given their full support to our youngsters and have trusted us with their education.

These results are more than just numbers; today, we not only celebrate the academic achievements of our students but also their personal growth, maturity, and the paths they are set to follow.
